Assessment of Student Learning for Manufacturing & Construction Faculty

Short Course: August 2 - August 22, 2021

Description

How do you really know that your students are learning what you had intended? In this three-week short course, you'll get an opportunity to examine the learning objectives in your course and the assessments that are aligned to help measure and evaluate student achievement on this learning objective.

During the course, you'll have an opportunity to explore traditional assessments or performance based assessments and make improvements to your own traditional assessment or scoring rubric to improve validity and reliability, as well as reduce the presence of bias in your assessment.

Finally, you will be able to apply the wise feedback method to provide effective feedback on a student work sample.
